### THIS WEEK'S LESSON: DOVE



#### IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

Even after the 40 days of rain, Noah and his family had to stay in the ark, as the earth was still covered with water. Noah sent out a raven and then doves to see when it would be safe to leave the ark. God promised that Noah and his family would survive the flood, and God fulfilled that promise. Genesis 7:24-8:17, The Flood Waters Recede



#### HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Have you promised the kids or your spouse something lately? It's time to make good on that promise. After you do, say a prayer as a family thanking God for keeping all His promises.



#### AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- How many birds did Noah send out of the ark before it was safe to leave?
- Why do you think Noah and his family trusted God to keep His promise and save them?
- How do we know that God will keep His promises to us?



#### AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

*"Lord, show me your ways. Teach me how to follow you." Psalm 25:4 (NIRV)*



#### PARENT TIME:

What you need to know:

God made many promises in the Bible, and He kept every one - even the ones about our future in Heaven. We can trust God to keep those promises because of promises like the ones He made to Noah. We can be thankful we have a God who, unlike ordinary people, always keeps His promises.
